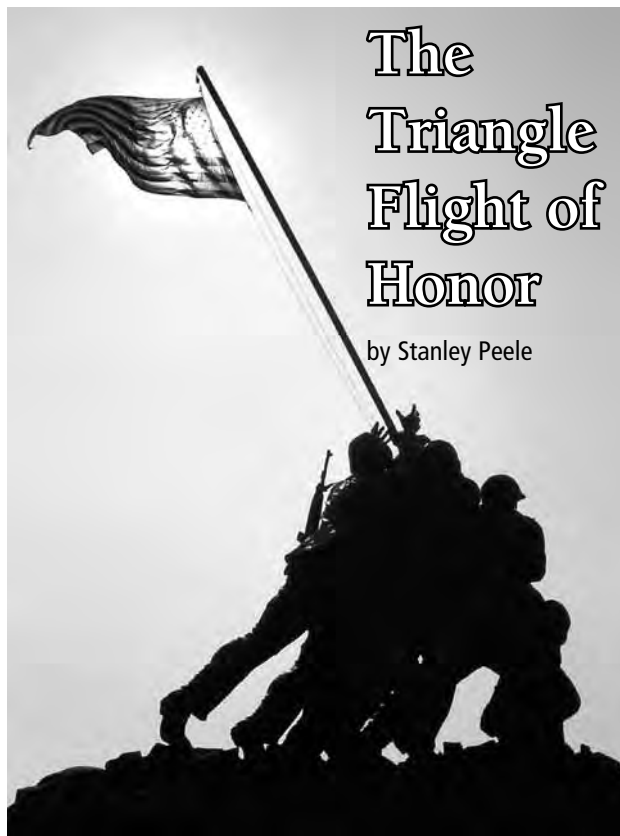
## A Message

## The Triangle Flight of Honor

This story is about four Cedars Members of "The Greatest Generation."

The Triangle Flight of Honor is a program to honor veterans who served during World War II. The veterans fly from Raleigh-Durham Airport to Washington, DC to visit World War II memorials. The preparation and planning for these tours is astonishing. The veterans get up before dawn and drive to the airport. There they join the other veterans. Volunteer guardians are on hand, one for every three vets. All vets in wheelchairs have a volunteer to push them.

In November of 2010, Don and Frances Alguire,

both of whom are vets, went on the Flight of Honor. Frances served from 1945 to 1950 as a Cadet Nurse, caring for veterans. Don served in the Army Air Corps in 1945 & 1946 as a member of the Cryptography School. Both became supervisors of their sections and ended up as supervisor of 1/4th of the school.

Bob Peterson is scheduled to go on the tour on May 4, 2011. He enlisted in the Navy in 1942 and served for four years. During that time he was a radar technician on Eniwetak Atoll in the Pacific for 18 months. Eniwetak was used as a forward base for the US assault on Japan.

On April 8, 2011, John Neter went on the Flight of Honor. He served in the US Army from 1943 to 1945 and was with the 34th infantry division in Italy on the front lines and later in headquarters. John arose at 5:15am and drove to the airport. As the plane took off, firemen positioned two fire trucks, one on each side of the plane. They fired water cannons over the plane—one on each side, forming a beautiful water gateway to start the trip. While on the plane, the volunteers made sure all the vets were comfortable. On board were a doctor and two emergency technicians. John was impressed. He had not realized that the organizers had gone to such lengths to protect the vets. Upon arrival in Washington, when the plane taxied in, they were again treated to the dis-

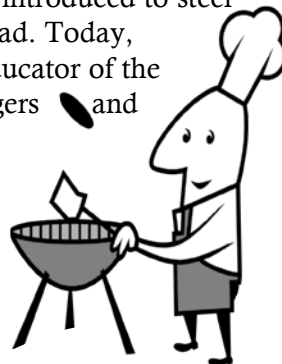
**The String Peddlers**

## Forgotten Ellis Island

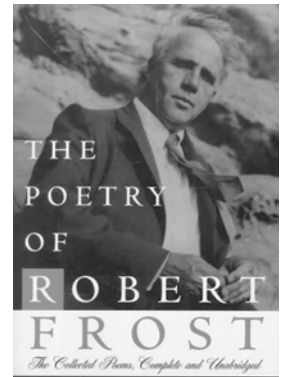

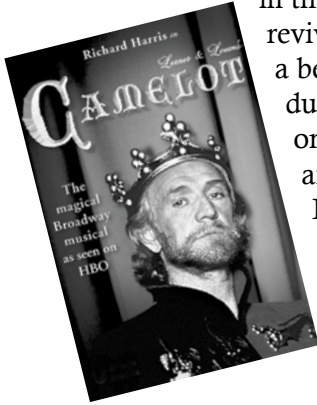

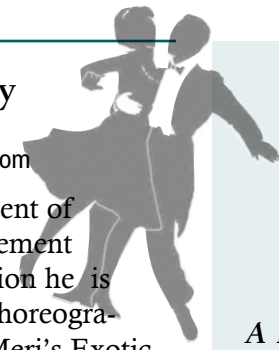

They were taken to the World War II Memorial. Senator Burr was there to greet them. Then they went to a marine barracks to see a silent drill. They saw the famous Iwo Jima memorial, a sculpture of the raising of the US Flag by marines. Then a wreath was laid at Arlington Cemetery; and they witnessed the changing of the guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

John was presented with a bulky envelope. It contained letters from members of his family, expressing their appreciation for his WW II service. It also contained letters from school children whom he had never met. This thoughtful touch carried a powerful impact.

That night they returned to the Raleigh-Durham airport. As they went into the airport, John was astonished! There were thousands of people waiting for them. People were cheering, reaching out to touch the vets and shake hands with them. They had signs reading "THANK YOU!" "WELCOME HOME VETS!" "WE ARE SO PROUD OF YOU!" and "WELCOME HOME DAD!!"

Some of the vets were bent over, some had canes, and some were in wheelchairs. Yet every one of them had a spark of light in their eyes.
