## A Remarkable Day in Wilson

On a cold but sunny day in February, 14 Cedars Members traveled by bus to Wilson, NC, to visit the home of Dr. Dudley and Lisa Anderson, where we were warmly greeted to view their vast collections of the world's finest art glass, ceramics and wood sculptures. Among the hundreds of objects on display in separate galleries and on all three floors of their home were works by many of the most important international glass artists such as Dale Chihuly, Harvey Littleton, Professor Stanislav Libensky-Janoslava Brychtova and many other renowned artists. The Anderson glass collection is internationally recognized and can be seen in the New York Metropolitan Museum of Art, Chrysler Museum, Virginia and Albert Museum in London, National Gallery of Australia, and our own North Carolina Museum of Art.

Originally planned as a single tour of the Anderson's collection, the trip became a day of surprises when we were treated to lunch at the Quince Bistro nearby. The Andersons then led us to the center of Wilson, past Vollis Simpson Whirligig Park under development and to a building where whirligigs created by the late Vollis Simpson are being restored. Local businessman Henry Watson spoke about the restoration of 30 whirligigs for the park as part of Wilson's business and tourism development program. But our interesting tour was not to end with these 50' high colorful sculptures.

The next stop was to the studio of the renowned photographer Burt Uzzle. Located in two warehouse spaces, Mr. Uzzle has numerous huge, truly dazzling color photographs mounted on the walls of one space. He explained how standard size photos, usually of people, are transformed into almost super graphic dimensions. We were also shown an adjoining warehouse space where the artist, using very fine grain film, creates photographs with backdrops of dark, textured irregular walls. The film is then developed in California.

This day in Wilson was time well spent. Next year, when the Andersons return from Europe, another group of Cedars Members should venture out to Wilson. Member Norm Innes, who took almost 100 photos, would love to return to this haven. It is becoming another creative center in North Carolina.

## The Patton Collection: A Gift to North Carolina

at the NC Museum of Art

This exhibition features an exceptional gift to the NCMA from the private collection of Jim and Mary Patton. This transformative gift significantly expands the scope of the Museum's permanent collection, both augmenting works by artists currently in the collection and adding works by artists previously not represented, enabling the Museum to present a comprehensive

picture of the significant movements in modern and contemporary art. Amassed over a lifetime, the collection includes seminal works by masters of mid- to late-20th-century art: Milton Avery, Richard Diebenkorn, Jackie Ferrara, Helen Frankenthaler, Adolph Gottlieb, Hans Hofmann, Ellsworth Kelly, Robert Motherwell, David Park, Sean Scully, Frank Stella, Wayne Thiebaud, and many others.

The Pattons have had long-standing ties to North Carolina. Jim Patton was born and raised in Durham and graduated with honors from UNC–Chapel Hill; Mary Patton (1929–2014) grew up in Durham and attended the Woman’s College (now UNC–Greensboro). **After the docent led tour we’ll have a chicken salad lunch at the museum’s Iris restaurant.** Sign up at the Concierge Desk beginning April 1, deadline April 15. ## LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

### The Evolution of the Pyramids and the Funerary Practices of Ancient Egypt

*with Member Herb Cooper*

Thursday, April 2, 3pm Ballroom



We will learn a few things about the ancient Egyptians and about the concept of the afterlife and the role it played in their funerary practices. You will see how some of their beliefs, culture, art, iconography and religious metaphors formed the basis of later religions such as Christianity three thousand years later.

We will visit all of the early pyramids, starting with the Step Pyramid of King Dozier. We'll learn about Imhotep, the brilliant engineer who conceived the idea of the Step Pyramid—the first structure that used quarried stone blocks and is still standing after 4000 years. Imhotep devised all of the logistics of pyramid building which included quarrying of the large stones, transport of the stones to the construction site, elevating and moving these large stones up the pyramid, developing the devices they would need for this task, and setting up entire villages to house and feed the workers.

Learn about Sneferu, the Pharaoh who conceived the smooth sided pyramid and was the father of Khufu who built the Great Pyramid at Giza. See the mistakes in construction in

the early smooth sided pyramids and learn how the great Egyptian engineers solved the problems which led to the completion of the Red Pyramid, the first perfect smooth sided pyramid and the burial chamber of King Sneferu.

We will find out who the workers were and why they would volunteer for this enormous task. Journey inside the Great Pyramid, climb the grand stair case and enter the King's Chamber deep in the middle. Travel up the Nile to Luxor to see the great temple of Karnack and tour the Valley of the Kings. Here we will go inside the tombs of Tutankhamun and Rameses VI. We will briefly discuss the mystery surrounding the death of the boy King and see why Tutankhamun's tomb was hidden for thousands of years.

### Yellowstone National Park in January

The oldest national park in the United States is also one of the most visited because of its natural beauty, great variety of wild animal species and the world's largest region of hydrothermal activity. Sitting on top of the Yellowstone Super Volcano the geysers, hot springs, bubbling mud pots and fumaroles make a winter journey to Yellowstone an unbelievable experience. Jerry enjoyed 12 days there last January and has pictures and stories to share.

## Art in Magic/Magic in Art

with Dr. William Spooner

This presentation is a visual fieldtrip through time. The trip begins 4000 years ago and progresses to present times with demonstrations of magical illusions representing various time periods. Famous art works depicting magic are shown and discussed. Likewise, art in magic is revealed in various formats. The interweaving of art and magic includes the infusion of politics, science, mathematics, and espionage. Bill Spooner's interest in magic began at the age of seven. He has been a member of the International Brotherhood of Magicians for 62 years and has served in numerous capacities including International President. For his long-time service, he was elected an Honorary Member in 1993 and in 2012 received the organization's highest recognition, The Medallion of Honor. Bill is a recognized author, publisher, magic historian, inventor, collector, and international lecturer. He retired from the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction in 1997 with 37 years of service.

## A River Cruise in Holland in Springtime

The Neter's river cruise began in Brussels, with its old "Grand Place" and richly decorated guild houses. They embarked on a riverboat in Antwerp and made the first stop in Holland at the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Kinderdijk, an old complex of windmills used for water management. They then cruised to the nearby Delta Water Works, a modern and very large project for water management. A stop in Arnhem enabled them to visit the famous Kroeller-Mueller Museum with its excellent Van Gogh collection and outdoor sculpture garden. Nearby they enjoyed the Netherlands Open Air Museum, which has a focus on Dutch culture of everyday life in years gone by. They stopped at Hoorn and Enkhuizen to see these charming harbor towns located on the IJsselmeer. The highlight of the cruise was a daylong visit on a beautiful sunny day to the gorgeous Keukenhof Gardens; its 80 acres are planted with over seven million tulips, daffodils, and hyacinths in many stunning displays.

## Popcorn and a Movie—*The Theory of Everything*

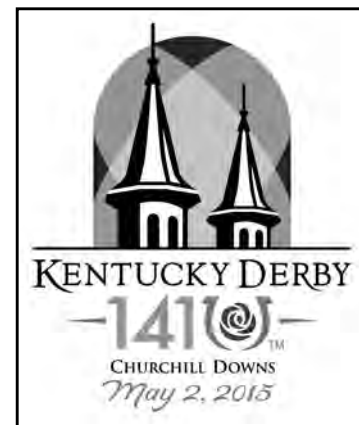

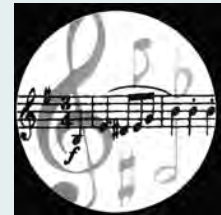

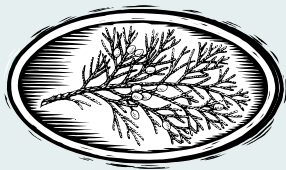
