Members Jim and Mary Patton Traveled Full Circle

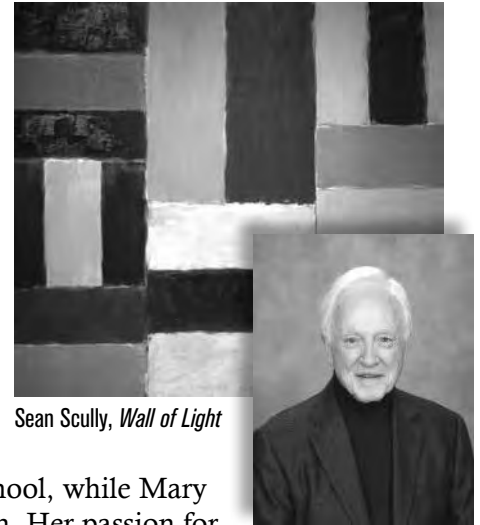
As young teenagers in the 1940's, Jim and Mary's first dance at Hope Valley Country Club signaled what would become profound love, and later, a devotion to the arts. While he graduated from UNC Chapel Hill, she earned her degree at what is now UNC Greensboro. They married

in 1951, Jim's last year at Harvard Law School, while Mary attended the Rhode Island School of Design. Her passion for art sparked his interest and together over 65 years of marriage, they amassed a collection of mid to late 20th century art to rival the best. When Mary died last year, it was her express wish to share their lifetime treasures with others.

After Jim's graduation from Harvard Law School, the young couple spent a few years in Asia where he worked for the CIA as Special Assistant to the US Ambassador in Saigon. The tour allowed opportunities for travel when they could absorb a variety of cultures and purchase unique collectibles. Upon their return to Washington, DC, Jim co-founded the law firm Patton Boggs, which he helped grow into a groundbreaking lobby firm. He also taught International Law at the Army War College in Pennsylvania and at Cornell University. Mary contributed leadership on Washington's cultural scene at the Hirshhorn Museum, the Smithsonian and at many philanthropic events. Life was exciting for their son and daughter as well and especially when they frequented Aspen, Colorado. There, they skied, Mary painted and they found life exhilarating. Along their journey, they were always attracted to art. As one critic commented, "the couple possessed a spot-on instinct," when the artist was quite new and his work was reasonably priced.

Over the years, Jim had also amassed a rare book collection. Beginning as an undergraduate, he purchased (\$50) *Californians* by Robinson Jeffers, his favorite poet. The collection is now worth \$2.5 million and was recently given to UNC's Chapel Hill Rare Book Collection in Wilson Library. Last month, Jim and his family also attended the grand opening of their lifetime collection (100 works) awarded to the North Carolina Museum of Art, valued at \$25-30 million. Artists such as Robert Motherwell, Ansel Adams, Frank Stella and many others are on display. Jim was thrilled to see this collection all together for the first time, in one venue.

On April 28, Cedars Members enjoyed a docent-led tour of the exhibit and fulfilled the Patton's vision, "to give pleasure to others." Smiling, Jim reflected that "he has had a happy life," recalling his youth in Durham and returning back in his later years, coming home full circle, with a noteworthy legacy.

Great World Religions: Buddhism

Buddhism challenges some of the most important Western ideas about God, human life, and the self. In Buddhism there is no single almighty God who created the world. Instead, Buddhism teaches that all of life is suffering, and there is no permanent self. And it teaches that in accepting that all life is bliss can be achieved in this life.

Professor Malcolm David Eckel is winner of Boston University's highest honor, the Metcalf Award for Teaching Excellence. He has spent most of his adult life studying Buddhism in Asia and North America, and shares his insights about this endlessly fascinating faith in this vital series.

In *The Edible South*, Marcie Cohen Ferris, daughter of Member Huddy Cohen, presents food as a new way to chronicle the American South's larger history. Ferris tells a richly illustrated story of southern

food and the struggles of whites, blacks, Native Americans, and other people of the region to control the nourishment of their bodies and minds, livelihoods, lands, and citizenship. The experience of food serves as an evocative lens onto colonial settlements and antebellum plantations, New South cities and Civil Rights-era lunch counters, chronic hunger and agricultural reform, counterculture communes and iconic restaurants as Ferris reveals how food—as cuisine and as commodity—has expressed and shaped southern identity to the present day. Marcie Cohen Ferris, associate professor of American studies at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, is also the author of *Matzoh Ball Gumbo: Culinary Tales of the Jewish South*. ***The Edible South* will be available for purchase. In part three, learn about the many details of the European WWII theatre, and part four concludes with the mighty, all-out invasion of Europe on D-Day.

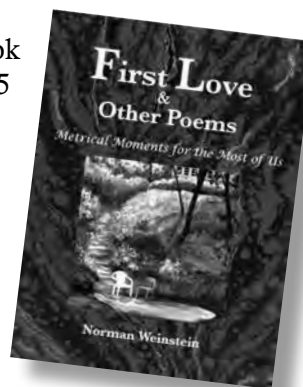


Members In the News

It is my deepest wish, then, that these poems attract, entertain, teach, amuse, speak directly to the emotions and the mind, even cause wonder, but above all that they be accessible and comprehensible to their readers and listeners and perhaps make the ordinary a little less so. It’s why I wrote ‘Sonnet for the Rest of Us,’ a suggestion that poems should scare away no one, but rather, in profound service to the language of which they consist, greet one and all warmly and, in a sense, say, ‘Here we are for you.’”—*Norman Weinstein*





During the winter of 1952, British authorities entered the home of mathematician, cryptanalyst and war hero Alan Turing (Benedict Cumberbatch) to investigate a reported burglary. They instead ended up arresting Turing himself on charges of 'gross indecency,' an accusation that would lead to his devastating conviction for the criminal offense of homosexuality—little did officials know, they were actually incriminating the pioneer of modern-day computing. 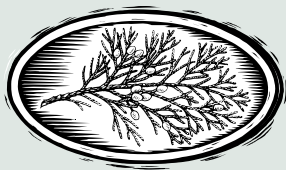
