The Cedars Classical Concert Series resumes Sunday, October 17 at 3pm in the Ballroom with a very special Young Artist Series performance: Tre Voce Leadership Ensemble. This very talented trio has won numerous awards and honors including First Prize with the “Young Musicians Inspiring Change” international competition which led to an invitation to perform at Carnegie Hall this Fall!

Members of the Tre Voce ensemble include:



**Leena Hocutt Duarte, violin:** Leena is an award-winning high school senior. This summer she performed as part of the National Youth Orchestra, which livestreamed their final concert from Carnegie Hall. She has appeared in master classes with Augustin Hadelich, James Ehnes, and David Chan.

**Tristen Johnson, cello:** Tristen is a junior at Rolesville High School and has been with NCCMI for two years. He studies privately with Nathaniel Yaffe of the NC Symphony and is currently co-principal of the Triangle Youth Orchestra. He was selected for the National Youth Orchestra this year.



**Hrishikesh Ram, piano:** “Rishi,” who has been with NCCMI for three years, is a freshman at NC State University majoring in chemical engineering and economics with a minor in piano performance. While in high school Rishi won many awards including statewide piano contests and chamber music awards.

These aspiring musicians are provided by the North Carolina Chamber Music Institute (NCCMI) whose mission is to inspire the artists of the future. The organization provides Triangle area music students aged 8 to 18 the opportunity to enrich their playing and learning experiences through small group ensembles mentored by professional music coaches. NCCMI is led by Elizabeth Beilman, Associate Principal Cellist in the North Carolina Symphony. The organization's coaching staff includes over 28 prominent local classical musicians, many of whom also are members of the NC Symphony. Four NCCMI students were selected for the National Youth Orchestra and will travel to Carnegie Hall this Fall!

Each year NCCMI features two to four leadership ensembles open by audition to extraordinary musicians. Members of these ensembles receive full or partial scholarships to the program. NCCMI strongly believes that performance opportunities empower young artists. Your support of the upcoming Cedars concert by one of these ensembles is a key part of their education.

It was also Pakistan's entry for Best Foreign Language Film (in Urdu and Pashtu with English subtitles) at the 2015 Academy Awards. It features heartfelt performances and breathtaking scenery. North Carolina Cooperative Extension Agriculture Agent Debbie Ross will give an overview of regional pollinators and discuss the principles of designing and planting habitat to attract a diversity of pollinators. Debbie will give a virtual tour of her popular demonstration pollinator garden in Pittsboro, NC that features over 225 unique species, 85% of them native to North Carolina. Since 1999 Debbie has been an Agriculture Agent for the Chatham County Center of North Carolina Cooperative Extension where she is responsible for programming in the areas of commercial vegetable production, organic production, pollinator conservation, alternative agricultural enterprises, forestry, and beekeeping. Debbie is passionate about pollinator conservation and has planted demonstration habitats and developed resources to teach others about the importance of bees and other pollinators to our agriculture ecosystem.

*Information about pool usage is as follows:*

- The pool is open 24 hours a day. Members can use their fobs to enter the Clubhouse before 7:45am and after 9:15pm.
- The pool is reserved for classes, water walking and physical therapy for part of the day on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
- Free swim hours: Monday, Wednesday and Friday: before 9am and after 4pm. Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday: all day.
- All Members must sign a liability release before using the pool.

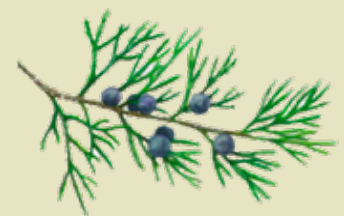


- Members are discouraged from swimming alone. A lifeguard is not present.
